

## FRANK MOTION ON JAN. 18.

**Attorney General Will Represent  
the State Before the Supreme Court.**

ATLANTA, Ga., Jan. 6.—Attorney General Warren Grice will make the formal motion in behalf of the State before the United States Supreme Court in Washington for the advancement of the Leo M. Frank case on the docket for an early hearing. This was determined in a conference between the Attorney General and Solicitor Dorsey.

The motion will be presented on Jan. 18, and the Supreme Court will be urged to hasten both hearing and decision. The selection of Attorney General Grice to represent the State has caused some surprise, as it was supposed that Solicitor Dorsey, who prosecuted Frank, would make the argument.

No intimation was given by counsel for Frank as to whether they would oppose the motion to advance the hearing. Both attorneys, Harry A. Alexander and Leonard Haas, however, said it was not their purpose to cause any unnecessary delay.
