ATLANTA, July 20.—Governor Harris announced tonight that he would accompany the Prison Commission to Milledgeville Saturday to investigate the attack on Leo M. Frank. "It will be a complete investigation of affairs at the prison farm," said the Governor. "I want to know how one prisoner was able to make an attack upon another."

## **DEATH RATE INCREASES.**

**Measles and Pneumonia the Cause,  
Health Department Reports.**

Statistics made public yesterday by the Department of Health show that during the past week 1,376 deaths were reported in New York City, an increase of ninety over the corresponding week last year. Of these fifty-two are accounted for by the increased population, the other thirty-eight to the virulence of measles and lobar and bronchial pneumonia. Bright's disease showed an increase over the corresponding week of last year for the first time in several weeks.

The increase in the number of deaths was evenly distributed among all age periods. In the group of those under 5 years old there was an increase of forty-three deaths. In the group under 1 year old there was an increase of seven deaths. The death rate for the first twenty-nine weeks of 1915 is 13.94, as compared with 14.42 for the corresponding period of last year.
