

GIVES TIME TO FRANK CASE.

**Governor Slaton May Be Ready to
Announce Decision Today.**

ATLANTA, June 17.—Governor Slaton is giving deliberate study to every detail of the appeal of Leo M. Frank for commutation and he announced this afternoon that there would be no decision in the case today. The Governor spent the night at his country home on Peachtree Road, where he has the trial evidence and other data presented by the State and the defense in their long argument which ended on Wednesday afternoon. He continued his study this forenoon, quitting only to go to his office at the Capitol at 11:30 o'clock to attend to some pressing official business.

After his announcement that there would be no decision today the Governor said that he would return to his country home at 4 o'clock to resume his consideration of the case.

It was considered probable that the Governor might reach his decision Friday. Not a hint has been given as to the probable nature of the decision.
