

DUNNE AT FRONT FOR FRANK

Illinois Governor Speaks at Clemency Mass Meeting in Springfield.

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., May 25.—Governor Edward F. Dunne, at a mass meeting at the State Arsenal tonight in behalf of Leo M. Frank, declared capital punishment to be "barbarism." The Governor said that Frank should not be put to death, that the Governor of Georgia should commute the sentence to life imprisonment. Governor Dunne signed a petition urging executive clemency.

The meeting was attended by 2,000 persons. Other speakers were ex-Governor Richard Yates, E. R. Murphey of Chicago and Elmer Perry and Rabbi Tedesche of Springfield.
