

CHICAGO, May 27.—Representatives of the Leo M. Frank Committee and the Anti-Capital Punishment Society today appointed a committee to wait upon the Governor of Georgia in the interest of clemency for Frank. The committee is composed of Judge John M. O'Connor, Chief Justice of the Criminal Court; the Rev. Johnstone Meyers, pastor of Immanuel Baptist Church, and Mrs. Mary Blany Fisher, representing women's organizations with a membership of 200,000. The committee will leave for Atlanta tomorrow night.

Women Make Speeches for Frank.

A number of women made speeches to a crowd in behalf of Leo M. Frank on the corner of 126th Street and Seventh Avenue last night. They obtained many signatures to a petition to the Governor of Georgia for clemency. Policeman Love of the West 123d Street station interrupted the meeting when a collection was started, but the women said that they had permission to take up one. The policeman telephoned Headquarters and was told that in this instance a collection was allowable.

Urge Clemency for Frank.

Columbus Lodge, No. 332, Knights of Pythias, which has its rooms at 310 Lenox Avenue, has sent to the Governor of Georgia a resolution appealing for clemency for Leo M. Frank. It was adopted unanimously at a meeting on May 25.
