THEY WILL SHOOT FOR GEORGIA AT CAMP PERRY

Mr. Wilson Admits He Believes on Foot To Incite Mexico War

Organized Desire Troublesome, He Says, But Not Cause for Alarm—General Mexico Situation Is Greatly Improved

WASHINGTON, Aug. 11.—President Wilson let it be known today that he was inclined to believe there was an organized desire—proceeding from sources unknown to him—to incite war between the United States and Mexico. The president does not regard the movement as extensive, but as very real, and he referred to it in a conversation to certain newspaper men. He indicated that he shared some of the views of President Williams, who had expressed his opinion that the United States should be on its guard against such a possibility.

There is no occasion for alarm, in the opinion of the president, who took pains to say that within the last few hours the Mexican situation had improved materially. It was made clear by the president to those with whom he discussed the matter that the instructions to him from his personal representatives were strictly to inform the American government how things stand generally, but not to discuss what were the opportunities for and against the United States. This was the main purpose of the president's visit to Mexico.
